Phony Baloney Association



Twin Rivers has had a 27% reduction in suspensions and a 45% reduction in expulsions. The District has incorporated a number of programs to address this issue.

About 75% of Highlands' students are eligible for a free lunch, while another 8% are eligible for a reduced-price lunch.

Over 20% of students at Highlands are Limited English Proficient; as a result, close to \$114,000 has been allocated to Highlands to help these students. The State has compensated to the tune of \$147,000 for this endeavor. Nearly 76% of Highlands' attendees are low-income students.

Dennis Weaver, Guidance Technician at Highlands, was recognized as one of two Sacramento County "Classified Employees of the Year." Classified employees are neither teachers nor administrators.

Are you doing anything on Saturday, April 9, 2011, from 6:30 p.m. until 9:30 p.m.? If not, why not consider attending the Project DREAM fundraiser at the Aerospace Museum. Proceeds provide funding for the students in the Twin Rivers Districts for arts, sports, and field trips - programs that were available to so many of us back in our school days.
