Is There Life After High School?

When I was approached about being highlighted, I was pleased and honored. However, I did find myself at a bit of a loss for words (which is hard to believe for a lawyer and a writer!). But, I decided what you all do *not* want is a resume (if you're really interested, check out my bio at www.milner-markee.com). So I decided to share some of my adventures with you instead.

I went to Sac State and graduated early in 1970 with a BA in Political Science/International Relations and a double minor in Spanish and Russian. While in college, I spent two years doing international studies at the National University of Mexico in Mexico City, taking all my courses in Spanish and improving my language abilities.

Having been bitten by the international bug, I set out to explore new horizons. So in the spring of 1970 I decided to "run away and join the Navy". Before I knew it, I was in Rhode Island at Officer Candidate School. Upon graduation and commissioning as an Ensign, I was assigned to the Chief of Naval Operations, Admiral Elmo Zumwalt, at the Pentagon. I was the only female on his staff and the youngest officer. Being assigned to NATO and Top Secret sections, I was privy to the most secret of naval operations, including the "Plot Room" deep in the bowels of the Pentagon. For a young college graduate, it was an assignment of a lifetime and Admiral Zumwalt became a mentor to me. My naval career soared and I was eventually transferred to San Diego, to an air squadron (I was the only female officer with 200+ men-WOW!!!). I met my future husband, Scott, a naval aviator, and we were married in 1971 after a whirlwind courtship. We served on active duty together while he spent three tours in Vietnam and two in Cambodia, I held down the fort at our home in San Diego.

Then, I was bit by the legal bug. I began working for a wonderful Captain, Lou Williams, who became the first black Admiral of the Navy. Due to his influence, I entered the legal field and resigned my active duty commission in 1973 to enter University of San Diego School of Law. When Scott was transferred to Denver, Colorado as Executive Officer of the Navy Recruiting District, I transferred to the

University of Denver School of Law. At the end of my first year, the day after I finished my final exam, I went into labor and my daughter, Tiffany, was born!

After graduation, I returned to active duty in the Navy and became a Lt. Cmdr. in the Judge Advocate Corps, the attorneys for the Navy. At that time, in 1978, there were only 7 women JAG's as compared to the 700+ men, so we were a small elite group of hard working women. I loved the JAG Corps, but due to family reasons, I resigned in 1981 and entered private practice.

I have since obtained two post-doctoral degrees, one in Space Law and the other in Federal Trial Advocacy. I am primarily a federal litigator, going to federal court to fight the government on such issues as illegal search and seizures and other constitutional matters. I have also taught at law schools as an adjunct professor. I truly love what I do.

One of my most memorable events was in 1991 when I was selected to participate in a group that went to Russia at the request of then-President Gorbachov to work with their attorneys and jurists to help them make the transition to a free market economy. I was thrilled to meet President Gorbachov and actually shared a box seat with him at the Bolshoi Ballet presentation. He was courteous and intelligent. We were all assigned to be "covered" by a KGB agent who trailed us everywhere. When I decided to change hotels without KGB permission, my agent actually chased me down the street and had me followed! Little did I know that the new hotel I moved to, the Savoy, was actually located right across from the KGB headquarters, so they didn't have too far to find me.

I am still happily married to my wonderful husband, Scott, and I am blessed to have as my law partner none other than my daughter, Tiffany. I have two precious grandchildren, Blake and Kelsey, both adopted from Russia! In addition to writing books, I love to ride my horses, as we have three and live on a small ranch in the foothills of San Diego.
