TIDBITS Twin Rivers Board Meeting

A reunion for Grant High's classes of 1950-55 will be held at the Crowne Plaza (former Holiday Inn), near Madison and I-80, on Saturday, September 15. The Grant Alumni will hold a fundraiser at the Dante Club on Friday, March 2, to "Bring Back the Band" at Grant. Music has taken a hit at District schools.

Both Highlands and Foothill are operating without a Library Media Teacher, which the Twin Rivers teachers union believes is vital for the education process of both schools.

Because of cuts in the District budget, all transportation and all student learning coaches were to be eliminated effective January 1. Bleak news indeed. The Twin Rivers Board awarded Jorgensen Sports Services a \$20,000 contract for referee and officiating services at Highlands.

The Twin Rivers Board recently approved that both District and Highlands officials attend the "Ninth International Conference on Positive Behavior Support" in Atlanta, Georgia. Money from the School Improvement Grant will fund the travel.

Principal Hawthorne and members of his staff presented to the Twin Rivers Board the "Comprehensive High School Report" for Highlands. Also, eight special education students from Highlands passed the California High School Exit Exam.
